

# INSTRUCTION FOR AUTHORS

Papers submitted for publication should be written in English. The text should be concise. By the rule, papers exceeding 15 typewritten pages, including 8 figures and tables, will not be published. Papers may contain sections and subsections only. Manuscripts must be single-sided and typed using double space only. At the beginning of the paper, under the title, the name(s) of the author(s) ought to be given. At the end of the paper the name(s) of the author(s) with degree and academic titles, and the exact address with company or institute affiliation ought to be given. Each paper should accompany a brief summary (50--150 words) written in the same language.

References should be listed in order of appearance at the end of the manuscript, using the form of the following examples (for a book, a paper in a journal, a paper in a contributed volume and for an unpublished paper, respectively):

References should be quoted in the text by giving the corresponding number in square brackets.
